

Plant facts


- Sixteen conveyor miles of assembly line
- In 2010, Ford invested \$400 million to renovate Chicago Assembly Plant and nearby Chicago Stamping Plant in preparation for adding Explorer production
- In April 2015, Chicago
 Assembly Plant produced the
 100.000th Police Interceptor
- In May 2015, Chicago
 Assembly Plant began
 producing the 2016 Explorer

History

- Ford began its Chicago operations in 1914, when it produced more than 4,200 Model T Touring sedans. The plant moved to its current location in 1924.
- Chicago Assembly Plant is Ford's oldest assembly plant in North America still in operation

History

- In 1942, Chicago Assembly Plant converted to war production, producing M-8 armored cars and M-20 reconnaissance armored units. It returned to the production of civilian vehicles in 1945
- In the past, Chicago Assembly Plant has produced a variety of vehicles, including Model T, Model A, Model B, Fairlane, Galaxie, Thunderbird, Cougar, Grand Marquis and Sable
