Zircote wood is an exotic hardwood whose unique beauty is typically reserved to dress up luxury yachts.

New to the automotive market, the reddish-brown to dark-brown wood with a unique grain pattern also is used to make fine furniture and musical instruments, including high-end guitars.

On 2015 Navigators equipped with the luxurious Reserve Package, the zircote wood accents the door panels, instrument panel, center console and steering wheel. Other than a thin protective coat, no stains or dyes are used, allowing the striking color and grain to shine through.

The attention to detail starts with the types of cuts to the wood. The linearity of the grain is maintained throughout the pieces to ensure harmony.

- Ranges in color from reddish brown to dark brown
- Most commonly used to create musical instruments, fine furniture and as a trim piece in luxury yachts
